A college-type schedule of classes for the high school was tried as an experiment the second semester. If it proves to be successful, it may be used in the fall.


New equipment included a microwave oven for the home economics room, a microfiche for the library and a tennis court for the school and community.

Best of all, some said, were the disco lessons held in the fall for students, faculty and community.






Decision Makers for Student Body

The council authorized the purchase of Varsity boys' basketball uniforms. They also discussed the purchase of weight machine, but the idea was dropped.




















Zoology Class Learns by Doing










A field trip took the zoology class to Mayr Bros' fish pond to learn how the hatchery spawns salmon.

advised both.




















- Sporting one of the best season records ever, the Loggers had high hopes of traveling to the Kingdome and the B-8 state championship.








Loggers Win One, Lose Two at District








